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Beacon Hill penthouse is extraordinary

Understated elegance is the essence of this fully renovated duplex with an outstanding roof deck in the heart of Beacon Hill at 132 Charles St. Each room and hallway reflect uncompromising attention to detail, from the quarter-sawn oak floors and six-panel wood doors throughout the house to the crown molding that follows every curved wall seamlessly and scalloped-designed heating vents. Horizontal electric outlets painted to match the baseboards are almost invisible, and even the doorknobs and hinges and fanlights above doorways are period-perfect.

Judy Pagano of Gibson Sotheby's International Realty has listed this 2,408-square-foot three-bedroom condo at \$3,250,000.

With three exposures, it has an abundance of natural light throughout the entire residence.

1870 South Boston home reflects grandeur

At the summit of Telegraph Hill, also known as Thomas Park, in South Boston is the Dorchester Heights Monument, built of white marble, commemorating the success of George Washington's plan to fortify the hill and force the evacuation of British troops from the city. It was a turning point in the American Revolution.

For nearly 100 years, the steep surrounding area remained farmland and woods, but as the city expanded, the north side of Thomas Park was first developed.

A roadway was constructed near the top of the hill encircling the park, featuring distinctive homes. They included three attached Second Empire houses built between 1874 and 1880.

One of them is the single-family home at 18 Thomas Park. Frank Celeste of Gibson Sotheby's International Realty has listed it at \$1,395,000.

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
